### **About Lyon**

Lyon is France's second largest city and capital of the Rhône-Alpes region. Combining an exceptional historic heritage with a natural liking for good food, Lyon is an ideal city for discovering all the charm of the French way of life.

A stage for more than 2000 years of history, the city has a remarkable architectural heritage. Expanding towards the east throughout the centuries, without destroying the existing areas, 500 hectares of its city centre became a Unesco World Heritage Site in 1998. Wandering around Lyon is like embarking on a fascinating journey through time. In each district Lyon displays an astonishing variety of architecture, from the roman theatres and the medieval district, via the elegant peninsula situated between the Rhône and the Saône, to the contemporary and original creations by Renzo Piano, Jean Nouvel and Santiago Calatrava.

The city also has a strong academic profile with 120 000 students (12 500 foreigners) spread in 3 universities, with a rich medical history from Rabelais, to Claude Bernard, Alexis Carrel, Charles Merieux ... and was a cradle of pharmaceutical industry.

All year round at nightfall the city is lit up thanks to its "Lighting Plan" that shows off some 325 monuments. For night owls, the city is teeming with festive, friendly places, with trendy bars from the Old Lyon to barge-restaurants moored on the banks of the Rhône, not to forget the wine bars on the peninsula.

Abstracts will be reviewed and assigned to appropriate sessions. Abstracts will be selected for Poster Presentation, Poster Moderated Discussion and a limited number of abstracts will be scheduled for oral presentation. Authors will be notified of acceptance and the format of presentation.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION**

- **1.** The abstract should be as informative as possible:
  - a) Aim: state background and specific objective of study
  - b) Methods: shortly describe methods used
  - c) Results: summarize results obtained
  - d) Conclusions: state conclusions reached
- 2. Standard abbreviations may be used.
- 3. Inclusion in the Scientific Program and Congress publications is dependent upon payment of registration fees.
- **4.** Abstracts should be submitted in good English, in order to facilitate fair scientific evaluation.
- **5.** Abstract length should not exceed 300 words.
